Andrew, age 13, has a gentle, quiet demeanor and a nice smile. He does well in school, and is happy and trustworthy. He makes friends easily, and loves basketball, swimming, Tae Kwon Do and music. He gets along with both older and younger children and assists many of the children at his home. He has a simple desire to be part of a family. He would like to join the military or become a policeman someday.

Edison and Kim (brothers) are bright and active. They would benefit from a strong male role model. Edison, age 17, is a 49ers fan and enjoys basketball. He is independent and can be a leader. He is shy at first, but expresses what he feels about many things. He demonstrates affection to people and to his brother. Kim, age 14, is multi-talented and inclined to arts and drawing.
